

Black Fork Mountain Shelter Completed

The FoOT shelter volunteer crew completed the 9th new shelter for the Ouachita National Recreation Trail, Monday, November 9th, 2015. The new shelter is the Black Fork Mountain location at mile marker 57.8 (N34 41.437 / W94 18.624). It is in a beautiful location about 200 yards up the Black Fork Mountain Trail off the OT. Upon completion of the final 3 shelters, FoOT will have completed its 12 shelter addition to the trail. At that time, the OT with its existing 9 older shelters will have a complete shelter system for the entire Ouachita National Forest portion of the trail, which is almost 200 miles.

Current plans call for constructing the Turner Gap shelter in March, 2016 and the Suck Mtn. shelter in April, 2016. The final shelter at Story Creek will be done in October of 2016, wrapping up an amazing project by many hard working volunteers. It is hard to believe that in about 3 1/2 years FoOT will have built all of the projected 12 new trail shelters.

Your will find a link on the home page that takes you to a listing of all the new shelters with their status, mile marker, and GPS co-ordinates. Hope you enjoy the new shelters. If you meet a FoOT volunteer, say "thanks".

FoOT is governed by nine directors, who the membership elects each fall. This fall we have three board positions to fill, and are seeking candidates for these positions. Board members serve a three year term. Those elected this fall will serve 2016 through 2018 (with two additional terms allowed). During that time, you would be expected to attend three to four meetings a year, to help provide overall guidance to the organization, to participate in the election of our operating officers, and to approve and monitor our financial position. Candidates for the Board positions must be identified by September 28th.

The Board elects the operating officers, which serve for the calendar year. Operating officers include the President, three Vice-Presidents (Maintenance, Membership, and Community Relations), and a Secretary / Treasurer. Candidates for officer positions must be identified by the end of the year December 31.

OT Trail Users:

FoOT has been notified by Central Arkansas Water that they will be doing a selective thinning of some of their property along the north side of Lake Maumelle. The work area will impact about MM 205-212, which is the second crossing of Hwy. 113 on the west end of Lunsford Corner. The work may begin by the end of July. Bids are being opened on July 9th. For safety reasons CAW will have to close part of the Ouachita Trail that runs through this area. "Trail Closed" signs will be posted once a definite start date has been determined. A buffer has been flagged for a 66 feet for the trail corridor. This will be 33 feet either side of the trail. We will post additional information as we receive it, such as how long this closure will last.

Hopefully the Holidays were good to everyone. We can look back on 2014 as a good year for FoOT. While a lot of "to do" items remain, progress was made in several areas. Our shelter project completed the 7th of the 12 planned for the OT. The first steps on establishing the Legacy Foundation for FoOT was completed. After a difficult year of trail damage and growth, maintenance efforts were able to keep the OT in overall good shape. Areas needing additional work are being addressed based on the recent audit of the entire trail. Now is the time for FoOT to look at the opportunities for 2015.

FoOT would like to solicit your help in this new year. Listed below are some of the areas you might be able to help with your time, talents, and/or funds:



- (1) The maintenance and improvement of the Ouachita Trail is the primary function of FoOT. Our adoption program is the heart of this effort. Look at adopting a piece of the trail. You will enjoy being on the trail and will find the effort very rewarding. Review the FoOT web site for more information. We want to make our adoption team stronger this year.
- (2) Join the FoOT shelter construction team. Lots of fun and a great feeling to see a new shelter completed. Seven of twelve shelters have been completed. Number eight will be built in late April on the Black Fork Mountain Trail just off the OT. Contact me if you would like to be on the email list for the construction team. If you know of any grants to assist this program let us know.
- (3) Be a part of the newly established Legacy Foundation, which will provide a perpetual source of funds for FoOT to maintain & protect the trails of the Ouachita Mountain Region for future generations. Estate planning pledges of \$475,000 have been made before the official campaign begins. Our goal is \$750,000 with a stretch goal of \$1,000,000. During 2015, \$10,000 in cash funds will be raised to open the Foundation account. Currently \$6,000 has been raised. Consider being a part of this important conservation effort. - (4) Become a member of FoOT. Review the web site to see the various ways you can become a member. The process is easy and it puts you into the FoOT communication loop.
- (5) Perhaps the easiest of all. Promote the trail, then get out and use the trail. It is a great natural resource that we have available to us. The response from trail users regarding the new shelters on the west end of the OT has been very positive. A greater user base means more feet on the trail, keeping vegetation down. More users also means a bigger pool of volunteers and supporters.
