## **Trail Maintenance Tool Suggestions**

Many FoOT members have inquired about which tools would be worth purchasing for trail maintenance on your trail adoptions. These tools can also come in handy around your own property. Loppers are essential! Below you will find some suggestions from our Trail Maintenance Department. We prefer Fiskars brand. Look for the Power Lever Bypass lopper.

For hand saws that are easily carried on the trail we recommend:

This saw cuts on the pull stroke and is very efficient. It is a great alternative to large one-man cross cut saws and has been used successfully to cut downed pines and smaller diameter hardwoods across the trail.
